We've had such a large interest in this trip, that we are now taking reservations for a second bus on the same schedule.

The trip will start with a stop in Williams for a no-host lunch at Granzella's restaurant and then we are off to a guided tour of the Shasta Dam where you will have time to visit the visitor's center before the tour. Dinner that night will be at Lily's-finest dining in Northern California. Computer History Museum

Since almost all IBMers I've talked to about this museum were unaware of its existence. I thought it might be worthwhile to share what I know. At 1401 Shoreline in Mountain View there is a Computer History Museum. The web site is www.computerhistory.org and it occupies the building at the northeast corner of the intersection of 101 and Shoreline. They have tours on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays from 1PM-4PM and on Saturdays from 11AM-5PM. Group tours are also available. The telephone number is 650-810-1038. While not entirely populated by IBM equipment, there are many old machines that will bring back memories for retired IBMers and their families. Along with some retirees I am helping restore a 1401 system, circa 1959, that the museum obtained from Germany. We generally are around on Wednesdays. It is somewhat operational and will soon be included in the tour and will have demos. It is a standard system with a printer, reader, punch and tape drives. It also has the auxiliary storage box that brings the memory up to a whopping 16K. Admission is FREE but they will accept and welcome donations.

The first is an easy, mainly flat loop route of about 1-1/2 miles along the Waterfall Loop Trail, which follows Swanson Creek. At a trail junction about ¾ of a mile along, the Waterfall loop goes back to our starting point.

At the trail junction, those preferring a more difficult hike (translation – hilly!) can continue with the hike leader on the Contour and Alec Canyon trails. Manzanita Point along the Alec Canyon trail offers a spectacular view. Total distance is about 4.5 miles for the more difficult hike.

To get to the park from Highway 85 going south towards Gilroy, exit at Almaden Expressway. Stay in the ramp's middle lane, make the first left, then the next right onto Almaden Expressway. Drive about 4 miles to the end of Almaden Expressway, and turn right onto Harry. Almost immediately, turn left onto McKean. McKean turns into Uvas Road after about 6 miles. Continue on Uvas for about 3.5 miles, and turn right onto Croy. Drive a little over 4 miles to the park entrance at the end of the road. About 0.4 miles before the entrance you will pass through Sveadal, a Swedish vacation retreat. Note that the speed limit is only 5 miles per hour on this narrow road. You'll have time to look at the quaint little cottages where Swedish flags still fly and you are reminded to look out for the trolls!

We will meet at 10:00 AM at the day use parking area. After going through the entrance (\$4 fee unless you have a county parks sticker) drive up the road a bit and look for the "day use parking" sign on the right side. There are restrooms available near the lot. Bring lunch and water.

#### Mount Diablo Hike Friday, April 13, 2007, 10:00 AM

Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> will be your lucky day if you join us on this moderately difficult 4.2-mile hike on 3,940-foot Mount Diablo. Mt. Diablo State Park is one of the Bay Area's ecological treasures. Every season in the park has its special qualities. In April, we hope to see some lovely wildflowers, and if it's a clear day, unparalleled views that are said to be as grand as those on Africa's Mt. Kilimanjaro.

You will be taking a long drive from San Jose to the trailhead, but once you are off the "beaten path" and driving on the back roads to the park, you will be in another world. We will be hiking on the Juniper and Summit trails, with a stop at the summit of Mt. Diablo. Our route is a loop, beginning at the Juniper campground. The hike involves about 900 feet of elevation gain, most of it in the first 1.5 miles. At the summit, we will stop for a visit to the museum, housed in a building erected by the CCC in the late 1930's. Restrooms and a small store are available here. The rest of the hike is mainly downhill using different trails, but with a surprise uphill jaunt at the end. We'll finish up with a picnic lunch at the Juniper Campground

To get to the meeting point from San Jose, travel towards Danville on Interstate 680 to the Diablo Road/Danville exit. Follow Diablo Road 3 miles to Mt. Diablo Scenic Blvd. Turn left onto Mt. Diablo Scenic Blvd – which soon becomes South Gate Road – and go 3.7 miles to the South Gate entrance station. Continue on South Gate Road another 3.2 miles to Park Headquarters and a junction with North Gate and Summit roads. Turn right onto Summit Road and go 2/3 miles to Diablo Valley Overlook, a large parking area at a sharp bend in the road, at the entrance to the Juniper Campground. We will meet in the parking area.

As the drive is a long one, with slow and curvy roads once you're off the freeway, we suggest that you allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Carpoolers should meet at the Camden Park and Ride (Camden & Highway 85) at 8:15 AM. Note that there is a \$5 State Parks entrance fee per vehicle. Because the trails may be muddy and there are some steep gravelly areas, we strongly encourage sturdy hiking boots and walking sticks. Dress in layers as it might be colder at the higher altitude. Bring your lunch and water and come prepared to see some great views!

The Bylaws state that:

- 1. All employees retired under an IBM Retirement Plan, Permanent Disability Plan, or committed to a Bridging Plan are eligible for membership. If a husband and wife are both eligible, each may become a member by paying dues.
- 2. The non-member spouse of a member may participate in all Club activities, but may not vote or hold office.
- 3. Associate membership is offered to the spouse of a deceased member.
- 4. Renewal must be completed by March to remain an annual member.
