Hikes

San Francisco Stairway Walk Friday, September 28, 2007, 10:00 AM

If it's September, it must be San Francisco. At least that's the IBM hiking group tradition. This year's San Francisco walk will be unusual in that it's an urban trek, almost all on paved streets and walkways. But oh, what walkways these are! We will use the city's stairways to navigate hills that are too steep for cars. When we scouted the walk, we counted a total of 550 stairs going up, probably about the same going down. So bring your most comfortable walking shoes and tune up your knees for this challenging walk.

We found the walk in a delightful book called "Stairway Walks in San Francisco." If you have access to the book, it is walk #11. Our route takes us through Golden Gate Heights, an area south of Golden Gate Park. It's a quiet residential neighborhood with a lovely park and great views. When we started the walk it was cold and foggy but by noon we could see Ocean Beach and downtown San Francisco.

Other than the stairways we'll navigate, your other challenge will be finding a place to park. We will be meeting on the corner of 15th and Lincoln, across the street from Golden Gate Park. We noted that there was available parking on Lincoln, with no time limit. Probably your best bet to get to the city will be the 280-19th Avenue route. When you get to Lincoln (just before Golden Gate Park), turn right and begin your search for a space. Carpooling is highly recommended! Carpoolers - meet at the normal place: Camden Park and Ride (Camden at 85), at 8:30 AM.

We didn't find a great place to stop for lunch, so we recommend bringing a snack and drink for munching along the way. Once we finish the walk there is a wide variety of restaurants nearby around 9th Avenue (we'll direct you) where you can replenish the calories you burned.

Garrapata State Park Hike Friday, October 19, 2007, 10:00 AM

Garrapata State Park is south of Carmel on Highway 1. Some of you who have gone on the Monterey Big Hike may be familiar with the area. We'll be hiking the Soberanes Canyon Trail located in the park. There aren't many places where you can see prickly pear cactus and redwood trees growing along the same trail, but that's what you'll find in Soberanes Canyon. The trail starts by following a year-round creek at the base of steep coastal hills, cutting through stands of willow, cactus, and chaparral. After ascending gently for a mile, you'll reach a cluster of redwoods and bay laurel perched beside the sandy pools of Soberanes Creek. From here, you can retrace your steps or forge onward, climbing much more steeply to Rocky Ridge Trail. Turn left to loop back, enjoying bird's-eye coastal views as you crisscross the high bluffs. We do plan to hike the entire loop, but if you want to do the shorter out and back route that's OK too. The 6 mile loop hike is rated strenuous (translation - hills). The 2-mile out and back is moderate. There are no picnic tables on the hike route, so we will probably just plunk down somewhere along the trail to eat lunch.

To reach Garrapata State Park, travel south to the Monterey Bay area. Then drive 7 miles on Highway 1 after you cross Rio Road in Carmel. The trailhead is on the east side of the highway near gate 13. Look for a line of cypress trees along the east side of the highway. A parking fee of \$5 applies within the park area. Carpoolers should meet at the Camden park and ride (Camden and Highway 85) at 8:15 AM. See you there! Don't forget your lunch and water.
