Winter Hiking at Harvey Bear Ranch Friday, January 23, 2009, 10:00 AM

Celebrate the New Year with an invigorating hike at a county park near Gilroy. The park is named after the landowners whose family made the park possible. The landscape consists of rolling hills with oaks and buckeyes and lots of wild turkey, deer, squirrels, red-tailed hawks and turkey vultures. The park adjoins Coyote Lake.
