### CA Statewide Museum Collections Center

**Tuesday, March 3, 2015**

Come see some of the history of California at the Statewide Museum Collections Center (SMCC), located on the site formerly known as McClellan AFB. SMCC serves as a repository for over 1 million historic objects and artifacts from parks throughout the state. They have carefully assessed, researched, documented, and preserved the irreplaceable items that reflect and illustrate the story of California's rich heritage. Our group will take a guided, 90-minute walking tour of the museum. Prior to the museum visit we'll make a no-host lunch stop at Brookfield's Restaurant, Sacramento.

### Gary Holloway Tour of Pleasanton & Livermore

**Thursday, April 2, 2015**

Gary Holloway will guide us on our visit to two of the most historic cities in the Bay Area and the Tri-Valley areas of eastern Alameda County. We will do a short history walk along **Pleasanton's** Main Street, and connect with such famous people as Phoebe Apperson Hearst, Max Baer Sr. and John Madden. Over a century ago Main Street was the setting for two famous silent films starring Mary Pickford. Pleasanton has evolved into a thriving suburban center, home to Silicon Valley high tech companies. By 1868 **Livermore** was the principal center of trade and shipping in the Valley. We'll walk historic First Street, looking at historic architecture and an historic tile mural, see the old railroad station and the world's longest burning light bulb, and visit the History Museum in the classic 1910 Carnegie library building. Along the way we'll enjoy a hosted lunch at Handles Gastropub in the Old Pleasanton Hotel building.



At the Club Annual Meeting on October 16, Club Officers were elected and Bylaw changes were approved. The list of officers for 2015 is listed at the left.

Bylaw changes:

- Simplify the definition of a club member. Both former IBM employees and their spouses are now club members. There are no more Associate members. This gives spouses all the same rights as their partners.
- Eliminate club officer term limits. The old rule was not more than 2 years in one office or not serving more than two years out of four. There have always been exceptions - the posts of Communications and Membership Directors have been held by the same 2 people for 16 years.
- Eliminate the Annual member. Everybody is now a Lifetime member.
- Eliminate the secret ballot for officer election. Voting will take place at the Club Annual Meeting only.
